<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Completion of at least 90 college-level (courses numbered 100 or above) credits, including transferred in credits, with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 is required to earn the AA degree. • Courses may only be used once in Basic, Distribution & Elective requirements. • Minimum passing grade of 1.0 is required in all courses. • At least 15 credits must be earned at the degree granting campus. • Students should apply for degree/graduation one quarter prior to anticipated graduation date. • Completion of degree does not guarantee admission to a university/major program nor that all general education requirements are met. 	
* Self-Paced & Seminar Courses are not eligible for Financial Aid and are paid out-of-pocket.	
** "Restricted" electives (maximum 15 cr.) – Any college level courses considered professional/technical courses. Examples = BTM, INFO, MIC, CFS, SHS, as well as Service Learning, Cooperative Education, Travel study, Work Experience, Library courses, etc. "While "restricted" electives (up to 15 credits) may count toward AA Degree completion, they may not count as electives for the specific major or school you are transferring to. It is highly recommended that you work with Academic Advising staff to understand how "Restricted" electives will work based on your specific degree and/or school goals."
