THE WOOD CONSTRUCTION CENTER of Seattle Central Community College is among the most comprehensive technical training facilities for the wood construction trades in Washington. Each program provides unique educational and hands-on training opportunities for both new and experienced workers. Programs include core training in safety, skills, tools, and materials with three distinct wood construction trade programs:

Cabinetmaking & Fine Woodworking Build skills in residential and commercial cabinetry, furniture construction, and many specialized areas of fine woodworking.

Carpentry Learn the basics of home construction, from blueprint reading and site prep to roof vents and trim fitting.

Marine Carpentry (Boatbuilding) Gain the expertise to launch a career in wooden and fiberglass boatbuilding, boat repair and related industries.

The Wood Construction Center also offers evening community education classes at a variety of skill levels.

Real-world training

Hands-on shop experience sets the Wood Construction Center programs apart and will give students a head start in the wood construction trade. Our experienced instructors emphasize safety, attention to detail and quality craftsmanship—qualities you can take with you in this rewarding career.

Building for the future

Beginning in 2010, the Carpentry program will be housed on the Georgetown campus of South Seattle Community College while the Seattle Central Wood Construction Center undergoes major renovation that will provide state-of-the-art shops, skills labs and classroom spaces. Cabinetmaking & Fine Woodworking

Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree, 120 credits.

Certificate, 103 credits.

- Students may begin any quarter.
- Cabinetmaking may be a good fit for you if you are detail-oriented, appreciate quality craftsmanship and enjoy working with wood and precision tools.
- Areas of study include woodworking and cabinetry, furniture design and construction, plus math and computer computation.
- Job titles include machine operator and tender, cabinet-maker, architectural woodworker, and furniture maker.

Carpentry

Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree, 102 credits.

Certificate, 85 credits.

- Students may begin any quarter.
- Carpentry may be a good fit for you if you are interested in the building trades, are detail-oriented and enjoy hands-on work.
- Areas of study include woodworking, concrete forms and floor systems, framing, finish work and window/door settings, plus math and computer computation.
- Carpentry jobs include work in construction, remodeling, maintenance and repair.



Marine Carpentry (Boatbuilding)

Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree, 138 credits.

Certificate, 118 credits.

- Students may begin any quarter.
- Marine Carpentry may be a good fit for you if you are interested in the boat building industry, are detail-oriented and enjoy hands-on work.
- Areas of study include lofting and layout, fiberglass lay-up and repair, spray gun techniques, boat construction and repair, and residential and industrial joinery; plus math and computer computation.
- Marine Carpentry jobs include employment in custom and commercial boat building shops and repair yards, or related trades.

Tuition
