



**Workforce Programs Articulation Agreement between
Seattle Central Community College
And**

Seattle Pacific University (SPU)

Seattle Pacific University (SPU) offers an “Upside Down” degree called Professional Studies. In this program, students complete an alternative general education curriculum and academic minor. The major they are awarded, called “Professional Studies”, is essentially their course work they complete at the community college.

To create a clear and easy pathway for students in Workforce Programs at Seattle Central Community College (SCCC) to transfer to and complete their baccalaureate degree at Seattle Pacific University, this **Transfer Agreement** outlines all transfer requirements, provisions, and related advertising considerations.

are eligible to be reviewed for admission to Seattle Pacific University’s Professional Studies program and will receive 90 quarter transfer credits upon admission. Transferring students must have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 to be considered for admission. Courses numbered lower than 100-level will not transfer.

If transfer work is used toward the degree (including Advance Placement, CLEP, and International Baccalaureate exams), official transcripts/score reports must be sent to Seattle Pacific University from the original institution or test program and credit will be awarded using Seattle Pacific University’s credit-granting criteria. Credit will not be awarded for exam scores below Seattle Pacific University’s minimum score requirements.

Seattle Pacific University will not award more than 90 credits (combined total) from community colleges, testing programs and non-regionally accredited schools. Courses with a grade lower than D or 1.0 will not transfer.


For students transferring with an AAS degree, they must also have earned a GPA of at least a 2.5 in 20 college level liberal arts credits from distribution lists within the areas of: English Composition, Arts and Humanities, Social Sciences, Natural Sciences, and Mathematics.


SCCC and Seattle Pacific University may choose to develop written materials which outline for SCCC students, the programs, policies and procedures relevant to this Transfer Agreement.


This agreement will remain in effect until a mutually agreed-upon change is deemed necessary. This agreement may be terminated by SCCC or Seattle Pacific University with appropriate written notification. Each institution agrees to provide termination notice one year prior to intended change.

SCCC and Seattle Pacific University officially authorize this agreement on 11 day of November, 2011, with the agreement becoming effective immediately.

SCCC and Seattle Pacific University agree to reevaluate this agreement two years from the date of the initial agreement, to determine if the articulation is still valid.
