➤ **WHO should register?**

- Students currently enrolled in ESL 4A – ESL 081.

➤ **HOW should students REGISTER?**

- We recommend that Level 4 students (4A & 4B) register for Grammar I and Level 5 students (5A & 081) register for Grammar II.
- **NOTE:** Please advise students that they will be given a diagnostic assessment during the first week and may be moved between these courses depending on their diagnostic results.

➤ **WHAT is going to be taught? How are ESL 85 & ESL 86 different?**

- A more detailed list of topics to be covered in each course is at the bottom of this flyer. General differences between the two courses include:

ESL 85

- **Foundational Grammatical Terms:** subjects, verbs, nouns, adverbs, adjectives, etc.
- **Sentence Types:** Simple & compound sentences
- **Verb Tenses:** Simple present, present continuous, simple past, future

ESL 86

- **Advanced Grammatical Terms:** phrases, clauses, subordinating conjunctions, passive/active voice, etc.
- **Sentence Types:** compound & complex sentences
- **Verb Tenses:** past continuous, present perfect, present perfect continuous, past perfect

➤ **HOW is it going to be taught?**

- Grammatical terms and rules will be explicitly taught and reviewed.
- Students will have opportunities to apply their grammatical skills in both spoken and written language.
