ESL 85

- Foundational Grammatical Terms: subjects, verbs, nouns, adverbs, adjectives, etc.
- Sentence Types: Simple & compound sentences
- Verb Tenses: Simple present, present continuous, simple past, future

ESL 86

- Advanced Grammatical Terms: phrases, clauses, subordinating conjunctions, passive/active voice, etc.
- Sentence Types: compound & complex sentences
- Verb Tenses: past continuous, present perfect, present perfect continuous, past perfect

HOW is it going to be taught?

- Grammatical terms and rules will be explicitly taught and reviewed.
- Students will have opportunities to apply their grammatical skills in both spoken and written language.
