Agency Description:

Washington Trails Association (WTA) is the voice for hikers in Washington State. WTA protects hiking trails and wild lands, takes thousands of volunteers out to maintain trails, and promotes hiking as a healthy, fun way to explore Washington. WTA schedules more than 900 work parties each year, contributing over 140,000 hours of trail work to public lands. WTA's volunteer trail maintenance program is among the largest of its kind in the nation, with over 4000 volunteers giving back to the trails they love – and getting a good dose of personal reward in return. WTA also works to protect trails through lobbying and grassroots advocacy on issues that impact hikers, like trail funding and wilderness protection, by working closely with federal and state policymakers to advance hikers' interests in forest planning and new recreation projects.

Position Descriptions:

Member of volunteer trail team – Spend your day on trail, learning-through-action what goes into building and maintaining WA State's extensive trail system. Trail work parties take place in the backcountry, wilderness, and some parks closer to home. WTA has an opt-in carpooling system to help you coordinate ride sharing.

Tues- Sunday 8:30 am - 3:30 pm

Minimum time commitment required of volunteers:

8 hours, most trails are 8:30am – 3:30pm. We credit everyone with <u>8</u> hours of service to account for driving time.
