 - I. They met yesterday, by next college council they want to have recommended principles
 - II. Established a working group to work on this document

 - I. Want to recognize faculty time
 - II. Why are some people still not coming to committee meetings?
 - IV. Will update RAC with budget timeline and submission deadlines
- Strategic Planning: Dr. Jenni Branstad and Mikaila Harris
 - I. District-wide committee is finalizing the date and structure of all campus forums
 - I. This will be a platform for engagement with Strategic Planning
 - I. There will be a smaller version of those forums for just College Council, Jenni will work with David to find time for those on future agendas
 - II. Special focus groups with Students, Union leaders
 - III. Interviews with Leaders around town, city
 - IV. We will gather all this data in the Winter, to code in the Spring to get our most important priorities

 - I. Will help us determine our priorities


V. Ad-Hoc Committee Update

- We decided to create an Ad-Hoc committee to discuss Council composition
- Outcome: Will work on the language and rules around Council composition
- Time: Meeting time Tues 3:15pm
- Modality: David to provide zoom link, will also be in the library
 - **I.** Anticipating only a few meetings, but it may take longer

VI. Timing of Lunch Break

- Context: Seattle Central in the past had a high school model
- After years of research, a block schedule was proposed by CCC+
 - I. Classes in 2 hour block, Fridays a free day (Student Services open, Library open)
 - **II.** Also had a 1 hour break for lunch or meetings (around 1pm)
- Yet this lunch break has not been held, why is that?
- Chantae has received information regarding this just today
 - **I.** This has not been built into the scheduling system
 - II. Presents some scheduling issues affecting student class scheduling

- III. As we do into schedule build in Spring, we will address these issues
 - **I.** We'll need to get on track to follow this policy
- IV. Polina mentions that the old model worked well for Culinary and the proposed change would be disruptive to their service.
- V. Chantae concurs that the break block needs to accommodate Culinary and is meeting with Associate Dean LePage to address these concerns.
- **VI.** What is the easiest place to view class schedule?
 - **I.** There are documents, but they're not user friendly
- VII. There should be a way to dynamically match classes to fit their blocks
- VIII. What planning tools allow them to see?
 - I. David: Something similar is on Starfish
 - IX. Clean Up Still Needed
 - I. But in order for it to work, we have to clean up the scheduling
 - II. Courses bleed into other courses, creates frictions in their process
 - III. Could Student Leadership get class schedule to plan more effective events
 - X. Reports for Data Visualization
 - I. Could we produce a data visualization
 - II. Any given day, this many people are on campus, when they're in classes
 - III. Jenni has such a tool and can walk you through the tool

 - V. This link will take folks to a Tableau User Agreement which will in turn take folks to a District Dashboard SharePoint. The highlighted dashboard shows unduplicated student counts by class schedules and modalities.

- I. Caution: Hard to take into consideration our hybrid classes
- XI. Next Steps
 - I. Next College Council Jenni to show this Tool
 - II. Jenni to send a link to put in meeting notes (see above)
 - III. ASC Students are invited to talk with Chantae about these issues so they can feel like active participants
 - IV. Alex:
 - I. For international students not many classes are available in person, they are required to take 12 units in person for their Student Visa
 - I. So this means they take longer and take unnecessary classes
 - II. Students prefer in-person classes. Online feels like self-teaching
 - I. It's great that Textbooks and resources are so accessible, but it feels like you could just do it by yourself
 - III. Lots of events during the "open block" but then that means they struggle to eat
 - IV. Some classes are listed as hybrid but have no in person classes, no building or room name then it's not likely to be hybrid
 - V. Edward:
 - VI. It's important to implement Block Scheduling as soon as possible.
 - VII. Block planning is integral to IT and those who have pathways integrated already
 - VIII. The pathway just says it was designed to completions by the state
 - IX. If you start on the track, you'll be on a set track without having to worry about scheduling
 - X. Designed to help the state see students start and finish
 - XI. Some of the transfer classes on the pathway and overloads the classes, don't have enough instructors to teach at a certain time
 - XII. Next Steps
 - I. Chantae will investigate Spring and Summer schedules and ctcLink improvements

VII. Auxiliary and Food Status Update

- Food Trucks
 - I. Successful overall
 - II. Requirement of \$800 or 60 Orders
 - I. Only needed to compensate for the loss twice
 - III. This quarter, we increased the frequency
 - **IV.** The weather has been impacting this service
- Culinary Partnership In Progress
 - I. Context: old Dining lost \$200k annually
 - I. Needs to be self-sustainable
 - II. Taking this into consideration to plan what we want to do
 - **III.** Planned Next Steps:
 - I. In Spring, start a partnership with Alki Bakery for grab and go items

- **II.** By Fall increase offerings in the Buzz and something in the atrium
- **III.** Hire another Chef and two part-time staff
- **IV.** Is there an option for regular student meals/ meal planning like they have at UW?
 - **I.** UW builds this with their housing, have more funding but it's worth looking into.
 - **II.** Also other options to get discounts at other food service places in the neighborhood
