Agency Description: Switch4Good is a nonprofit advancing food equity and nutrition security by working at the intersection of public health, education, and policy. We start with dairy because of its outsized impact on human health and the injustice it perpetuates in marginalized communities. We equip individuals, universities, and governments with the tools to make evidence-based, systemic change for good.

Position Descriptions:

Projects available with Switch4Good include 1) writing letters to the editor and op-eds, 2) researching and writing articles to be eligible to be posted on the Switch4Good blog, 3) proposing awareness and behavior change campaigns, 4) working with university staff to expand plant-based eating in dining halls, and 5) planning an on-campus event to educate their peers. Students are also able to develop their own project with their professor and Switch4Good staff; full descriptions are available here:

Days and hours students can serve in this position: Switch4Good staff will be available 6 am-5 pm PT Monday-Friday, but students can work independently whenever they choose to.

Minimum time commitment required of volunteers: 20 hours over the course of the quarter, with the ability to increase to however many hours students would like.

What qualities, abilities and skills are important to your agency?

1. Have an interest in learning about changing social norms around food through writing, public speaking, and legislative advocacy.
2. Be enthusiastic to give and receive feedback and ask questions when confused.
3. Possess strong organizational skills and be able to fulfill responsibilities by deadlines.

Is volunteer orientation provided? Yes, virtual orientation will be available via a Zoom meeting scheduled by appointment.

Length of time students should budget for it: 45 minutes, including time to fill out an onboarding form prior to orientation.

Is volunteer training provided? Yes, as a part of the orientation call.

Length of time students should budget for it: 30 minutes for the call and an additional 15 minutes to read expectations and project deliverables documents.

Is on-site supervision provided? No, because this is a virtual opportunity. Students will be able to meet virtually with staff whenever they would like to and will be asked to check in regularly over Zoom and through Google Form check-ins.
