Agency Description: AIM enriches the lives of people in the disability community through active engagement with and access to movement and the arts. We do this through weekly classes, summer camps, school break camps, and our arts-based adult day program. AIM engages Disabled community members by providing opportunities for self-expression, connection and belonging through adaptive arts education and artistic experiences in an accessible and welcoming environment.

Position Descriptions: During the academic year, we will have multiple opportunities to volunteer in our adaptive programs each week! AIM volunteers serve as 1:1 Buddies in classes such as adaptive dance, music therapy, adaptive art, adaptive theater improv, and more! As a volunteer, you will be connecting with and supporting Neurodivergent and Disabled group members, participating in all class activities, and assisting staff as needed.

Days and hours students can serve in this position: We have **weekly one hour classes**. Most programming takes place on the weekends, with a few classes happening on weekday evenings.

No arts background is needed, nor experience working with children or Neurodivergent/Disabled individuals. All that is needed is a willingness to learn, connect, and encourage.
