WHAT IS WORKER RETRAINING?

Worker Retraining is a Washington State program that pays for all or most of the cost of attending college and is available to students who have applied for or are receiving unemployment insurance (UI). To be eligible, you must have applied for UI and be enrolled in professionaltechnical education program (see back page).

Worker Retraining can cover the cost of:

Tuition and fees

Books

Transportation

Tools for classes

Supplies/uniforms required for classes

To apply for Worker Retraining support, you must apply for UI at http://esd.wa.gov/unemployment

(or be already receiving UI)

YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR UI AND WORKER RETRAINING IF ...



You have recently **lost**your job, regardless of
how many hours you
worked each week or how
long you worked for the
employer; or your work
hours have reduced



You were a gigeconomy worker (such as driving Uber or Lyft) and experienced a loss of income or work hours due to Covid-19



You were **quarantined due to exposure** to
Covid-19, even if your
place of employment
remained open

EXPANDED ELIGIBILITY FOR UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS

Under new rules, you may receive up to 39 weeks of unemployment benefits and an additional \$600 in weekly benefits through July 31, 2020.
